



Voter Guide to the 2018 Election

Absentee Ballot Voting Information

If you are not available for in-person voting on Tuesday, November 6th, 2018, you have the following options:

- download an absentee application online at <http://www.saratogacountyny.gov/wp/wp-content/uploads/2013/11/AbsenteePageTwo.pdf>
- fill out the application for a "General Election" (section 7, not section 6) and postmark by October 30, 2018, or drop-off application in-person to the County Board of Elections by November 5th, 2018.
- Local Election office RECOMMENDS YOU APPLY/MAIL ABSENTEE APPLICATION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE this year.
- for Saratoga County, BOE address is 50 West High Street, Ballston Spa, NY. Phone number for Board of Elections is (518) 885-2249 if you have questions. Last day to POSTMARK RETURN BALLOT is Monday, November 5th, 2018.
- If mailing return ballot, it must be postmarked by November 5th, 2018. In-person return of completed ballot to your county board by the close of polls on election day.

In-Person Voting Information

Tuesday, November 6th, 2018

6 a.m. - 9 p.m. (ONLY 16 HOURS)

The most important piece of information for November 6th, 2018, is to BE AT THE CORRECT AND CURRENT VOTING LOCATION based on your present address:

- Polls open at 6 a.m. and close at 9:00 p.m. If you are IN LINE by 9:00 p.m. you have a right to cast a vote. Doors are locked at 9:00 p.m.
- Poll workers are there to assist voters in locating their correct polling location and district and are well-trained in making sure voters cast a legal vote.
- Election Day questions that cannot be answered by on-location workers or supervisors can be directed to 1-855-VOTE-4-NY.
- If for any reason you are not listed as a registered voter at your correct polling location for your current address, you are entitled to ask for an AFFIDAVIT BALLOT which will record your vote on election day. Affidavit ballots are reviewed and counted if they are found to be valid.
